Chamber Members Visit Capitol

Highlands Ranch Chamber members had the opportunity to step foot inside the workings of the State of Colorado government on February 9 during the first of two “Mornings at the Capitol”. These events, sponsored by the Douglas County Business Alliance, give business leaders in Douglas County a chance to see up close what goes on during the legislative session and also show support for business friendly legislation and opposition to legislation that does not create an environment for growth and job creation.

“Our Douglas County representatives are doing a very good job of representing our members by supporting a business friendly government that encourages business to create jobs,” commented Steve Dyer, Chamber President, “The challenge is trying to balance the budget for 2010 without bringing too much damage to our members who are currently running a very lean budget themselves.”

The group heard from Douglas County Representatives Frank McNulty, Carole Murray, Minority Leader Mike May and Representative Joe Rice, Littleton, during the meeting with the delegation. Each representative gave a feel for the process and pace of the session and highlighted bills they are carrying individually. Representative Ferrandino, a member of the Joint Budget Committee, gave the group a snapshot of the make-up of the Colorado Budget and the process of trying to balance it. The morning ended with the group going on the House floor and listening to bill reading and discussion.

The second of two “Mornings at the Capitol” is scheduled for March 9th. The morning will begin promptly at 7:30 a.m. by visiting with the Douglas County Delegation.
